WELCOME to the FEBRUARY edition of LINK



One of my greatest frustrations with the church's seasonal calendar is the fact that, thanks to Easter, *Cadbury's* Mini Eggs are only easily available for a few months each year.

It's a funny thing that Easter is linked so strongly to eggs. Indeed, for many it indicates that Christianity is just trying to usurp older, pagan religions, and has no meaningful contribution of its own - light shining in the darkness at

Winter, and celebrations of new life in the Spring - eggs, baby bunnies and spring lambs - are part of many cultures' rhythms. Even the word Easter has no clear Christian origin, but is thought to be derived from the name of the ancient Saxon goddess of Spring: Eostre.

But even if the ancient church blurred the lines when they eased the transition of northern European cultures to Christianity by lining up their festivals with those of the pagan traditions they were absorbing, the fact remains that Christianity proclaims one wildly distinctive point of faith, namely that the same Christ who died on the Cross one Good Friday afternoon, and who lay dead in a tomb over the next two nights, returned to life on the Sunday.

This reality offers a hope much greater than the endless cycle of life and death, where last year's livestock are replaced by this year's lambs. The Christian hope is in the cycle of life and death being broken entirely, so that death no longer needs to be the last word for any of us - by faith in Jesus' death for us, we can be assured of receiving the same everlasting life He received, beyond the grave.

The egg encapsulates this Christian distinctive nicely. The life contained within an egg is destined to burst out, leaving behind an empty shell. And that empty shell points us towards the empty tomb that the risen Christ left behind on Easter Sunday.

So as spring begins to emerge, let us enjoy our symbols of new life, but let us depend, above all on the one who offers us life without end.


Diocesan news

11th January 2025

Bishop Rhiannon was installed as the 17th Bishop of Southampton in Winchester Cathedral.

2025 marks the 1700th anniversary of the introduction of the Nicene Creed.

The Nicene Creed is **the defining statement of faith or belief for all Christian people**. It was created to have one universal statement of faith for all Christian people no matter where they were or which denomination they followed. The Nicene Creed is used in important services and every Sunday during worship.



NEWS FROM OUR MISSION PARTNERS

From Bible Society - in Nov 24:

Greetings from our long-suffering Ukraine! Today we had another terrible night and morning. Russia has intensified its strikes, targeting Ukrainian cities nightly. Over the past two weeks, our children have spent more hours in bomb shelters than in school classrooms. We experience psychological, emotional and physical exhaustion. People are dying every day.

'This morning I heard explosions and saw columns of smoke not far from the Bible Society office. I quickly got ready to go to the office. But the road was already blocked because of debris from Iranian drones that had hit the area. I learned that the explosions occurred about 700 meters from our office, which provided some reassurance. The Psalm 23 garden from the Chelsea Flower Show is now installed at the Winchester Hospice. In Nov 24 Hazel Southam wrote of its significance ...

'The beautiful flowers and the sound of the water help us to take a deep breath and go back inside and be as compassionate and kind as we have ever been,' she added.

Hazel Southam, Psalm 23 Garden project manager said, 'We are so delighted that the Psalm 23 Garden is giving people a living sense of God's presence and restoration, at Winchester Hospice.

'It was so important to us that the garden lived on after the RHS Chelsea Flower Show. It's in a wonderful setting where it can make a difference to patients and their families in very difficult times, as well as being a restorative place for staff to take a break.'

From Leprosy Mission

The team at Anandaban are facing the most challenging time in its history.

In late September, deadly monsoon rains hit the Kathmandu valley. The district surrounding the hospital sadly bore the brunt of the downpours.

The floods caused catastrophic landslides at Anandaban. The team are working tirelessly to clear the debris. But the recovery and repairs will take time.

The landslide damaged the water and electricity supply. Thankfully, the hospital team have made temporary repairs so they can continue providing emergency care. But a sustainable solution is needed.

Your support and prayers are an incredible encouragement for the team and patients at Anandaban. Thank you for your continued kindness for people affected by leprosy in Nepal.

THOUGHTS FROM MY GARDEN ...

Another new year has started; with all that is going on in the world I hope it will be peaceful. It has been cold, but that will be good for the garden as some plants need a period of cold to flourish.

Soon we shall be able to get out and start the growing process all over again and watch the beauty of nature take over. There were about 12 long-tailed tits on the fat balls one morning while I was having my porridge. They don't stay long, so you need to be watching or you miss them. They are such pretty little birds. I wonder how do they cope with the long cold nights we are having? Some birds huddle together to keep warm. Perhaps these do as they do go around in a group.

A pheasant has been visiting, clearing up under the bird feeders. He knows where the seed comes from as he looks up when he wants more! I had been putting food out for the hedgehog, which was being eaten overnight, but why had the hedgehog not hibernated? I was about to get a wildlife camera when one afternoon, just as it was getting dark, a black cat appeared in the drive and walked around the house to where the food was, under the wheelbarrow. Yes, I was feeding a cat! He did come the next day but only found three bits of food. I expect his family are wondering why he is now so hungry in the evening!

The Archbishop of York has written to all members of the Church of England. The full text, which can be read on his website, is a seven minute read, so this is an abbreviated version!

Epiphany letter to the Church of England

Archbishop Stephen has written to all clergy, lay ministers and people in the Church of England today, on the Feast of Epiphany.

Dear Friends in Christ,

Mindful of the ongoing challenges facing the Church of England, I write to you, the people of the Church of England, trusting that with God's guidance, we can look to the future with great hopefulness in Christ. The Magi came to the Christ child and their lives were re-directed. Please join me in praying for the renewal of our church as we come again to Christ to seek God's way for God's church.

First, I want to express my deep gratitude for your faithfulness. The unstinting witness and service of parish churches brings hope and light, embodying the message of the Gospel, a message of peace and of new beginnings that is needed so urgently in our world as well as our church.

Working closely with Sarah, the Bishop of London, for most of the next year it falls to me to help guide the Church of England through these challenging times. I am hugely grateful for the affirmation and support I have received, though I know and accept that some people have concerns. But aware of my own needs and shortcomings I pledge myself to learn, and I pledge myself to do what I can to steer through the change we need on these important issues and to hold myself accountable, both to the processes we have at the moment and to the new ones we will introduce. I invite the people of the Church of England to do the same and in your parish to pray for the stability, good governance, and renewal of our Church. Such a renewal of prayer, a new dependence upon God and a new focus on discipleship, living out our Christian vocation each day, will, I believe, help us to become a simpler, humbler and bolder church.

Finally, in this Epiphany-tide, I am reminded that in Christ God comes to us in the most vulnerable thing we can imagine: a tiny, newborn child. Let us learn from this and ensure that we are putting the needs of the vulnerable first. Let us commit ourselves to becoming a Church that looks and sounds like Jesus: penitent, kind, and in tune with the will and purposes of God.
