Greetings!

This month is due to see a long-awaited moment in the parish, as the church gathers in celebration at St Andrew's on Tuesday 13th to support the Rev Simon Hones, as the Acting Bishop of Southampton comes to license Simon as an Assistant Curate to the parish.

Simon has spent his adult life in ordained ministry, serving in churches big and small, rural and urban, most recently in the parish of Marchwood on the other side of our large Deanery. He brings a great deal of experience and wisdom to the role and I am delighted to have him join me as a ministry colleague.

Like the long line of assistant ministers who go before him, Simon will be licensed to serve the whole parish, but will be living in the Church Cottage next to St Andrew's Church and he will take the lead in pastoring the St Andrew's congregation, supported by our very able team of retired clergy and lay leaders. He and I will also be considering what other ministry focus he might take on across the parish while he is with us.

We have waited long for Simon's arrival, and I am grateful both to him and to the church family for waiting patiently while the diocesan administration has taken some time to be completed. I am also deeply grateful to Rev Angie Gammon for stepping into the breach whilst the vacancy wore on, and for doing such a fine job of caring for the St Andrew's congregation over the last nine months. There is a real warmth of fellowship at St Andrew's, and Simon has a wonderful opportunity before him, thanks in no small part to Angie's ministry.

Please join me in praying for Simon as he prepares for his Licensing and settles into the role over the coming weeks.

The Life of Christ - Wintershall

The Life of Christ was performed from 18-22 June on the beautiful Wintershall estate in the Surrey hills. Over 5,000 people attended. 70 primary and secondary schools brought children to enjoy it. Audience members travel from all over the UK to enjoy this annual event.

The Wintershall cast is made

up of 100 people who are mostly volunteers and the production includes horses, sheep, doves and a donkey. The greatest story of all time is movingly recreated in the open air with authentic detail, outstanding quality sound and music.

The Life of Christ is a passion play not to be missed. The performances include the Wedding in Cana, the Feeding of the 5000 and the Last Supper which unfold before your eyes. This is an immersive production with the actors walking amongst the audience and audience participation is encouraged during certain parts. The audience moves through four locations throughout the day with wonderful views of lakes, forest and open parkland.

Each day runs from 10am to 3:30pm with free parking for cars, minibuses and coaches. Mobility vehicles and an excellent sound system make it a very enjoyable day for all. The dates for 2025 are 17-21 June and bookings can be made online on the website www.wintershall.org.uk or by calling 01483 892167. Wintershall will also be performing the Nativity Journey from 11-16 December and the Passion of Jesus (in London) on the 18th April 2025.

Wintershall education department also provide a school Assembly programme with a Wintershall actor, in costume, performing short moments from 'The Life of Christ' as 15-minute dramas. For schools further away, there are Online Assemblies with a choice of 5 special pre-recorded assemblies.

Anya's VISION for Youth and Children's Work

I have so enjoyed my first four months as Children's and Youth Worker here at Hordle and Tiptoe Church. There've been so many exciting things I've had the privilege of being involved with and have met so many wonderful people. Over these months I have been working on a vision for Youth and Kids ministry here to set the purpose and direction of what we do and I presented this to the church back in June. Below is a summary of what I shared:

Mission Statement (based on Psalm 78):

"We will tell the next generation the praiseworthy deeds of the LORD, his power and the wonders he has done, so that they would put their trust in God and would not forget his deeds but would keep his commands."

This is our overall mission for this ministry and will be our heartsong. It's a call for both Christian parents and carers at home but also us as a whole church to tell the next generations who God is and what he has done for them through Jesus, and it's a call on the children and young people to respond to that message in faith and obedience. Everything we do in Youth and Kids ministry will be to fulfil this mission statement.

Principles and Priorities

Coming out of this mission statement, as well as Romans 1:16 and Deuteronomy 6:4-9, are 3 priorities (what this looks like in practice), and 3 principles (how we're going to carry this out)

Priorities:

- To support parents and carers in raising the children in their care to know and love Jesus
- 2. To provide children and young people with the opportunity to hear and respond to the gospel of Jesus Christ
- 3. To equip children and young people to mature in faith and disciple others

Principles:

- 1. Founded on prayer
- 2. Centred around Scripture
- 3. Discipled by disciples

Future

Going forward, the groups and events we currently run will continue, perhaps with a couple tweaks. There's so much great stuff already being run by the church and we have great partnerships with both primary schools. Here are some other things I would love to explore and introduce over the coming year:

- WhatsApp group for parents and carers to stay in touch and one another (plus an email list) to share prayer updates
- Taking a group to summer camp and having other members of the church sponsoring and praying for those going on camp. A whole church partnership in helping these young people grow!
- I'll be helping run the Church School Vision Group at Hordle School
- Running a Holiday Bible Club for the children in the villages over the Easter holidays
- Taking young people to bigger gatherings and conferences in London and Southampton
- Keeping parents and carers informed of good resources to help them parent their children and explore faith with them at home, and provide termly bookstalls
- Events for the whole family, including a potential Bible conference in the New Forest next summer
- Discipleship groups for every age, working together to teach the children and young people the whole Bible comprehensively over their childhood:



A space for 0-4 year olds during the 10.30am church service. There will be toys, a Bible story and craft/colouring that can be led by parents/carers, and a relay of the church service. On each 1st Sunday there will be two leaders to run this so parents/carers can stay in the service.



A group for children in Primary School who will go out for the middle part of the 10.30am service for age-specific Bible teaching, game and craft (except for 3rd Sunday of the month when it's an All Age service).



A group for young people in Secondary School who want to dig deeper into the Christian faith, run in partnership with River of Life Church in Tiptoe. Meeting every Tuesday evening during termtime for a Bible Study, games, snacks and fellowship, along with regular socials.

I am excited to see how God will continue to work in the coming months. I'm grateful for the team who already serve and look forward to serving alongside more of the church family as (we trust) this ministry grows. youth@hordleandtiptoechurch.org.uk

Oakhaven Acorn Project

Oakhaven Hospice, Lymington



Hordle Primary School children were invited to Oakhaven to take part in the Acorn Project. This valuable project allows the children to visit and learn about its history, meet patients, staff and volunteers and learn about the vital role the centre plays within our community.

Week One

A small group of Year 6 pupils headed to Oakhaven for the first time. In week one, they met patients and volunteers, began an art project inspired by national parks and heard stories about the adults' favourite memories of their trips to national parks.











Week Two

In the second week, the children continued their art project, had a tour of the grounds and even got to have a look at an inpatient bedroom and bathroom. Some of the children shared memory boxes with staff and patients, symbolising items and memories that are

important to them. There is so much specialised equipment and it is very clear just how hard the staff work to make Oakhaven a sanctuary for their patients.

Week Three

In the final session, the children shared the last of their memory boxes, met Alfie the therapy dog and even took part in a Sports Day race. The children were amazed to hear that Oakhaven have to fundraise almost 8 million pounds each year just to keep running.

We are so very fortunate to have such a wonderful hospice in our local community.

THOUGHTS FROM MY GARDEN ...

A few weeks ago, I went shopping and parked my car under some trees with low branches. After packing my bags into the boot and myself into the driving seat, I realized I had company. On the windscreen wipers was a goldfinch, a tiny bird smaller than a wren. I think he had seen his reflection in the windscreen as he seemed so interested in this other bird. My presence did not bother him at all, even when I tried to persuade him to leave. Eventually, he got the message and stayed on a branch.

When I went shopping about ten days later, the same thing happened, only this time he would not stay on a branch. Before I could get back into the car, he was back on the windscreen wiper! This must have gone on for about five minutes with me getting in and out of the car, gently shooing the bird up into the tree and then him coming down again before I could drive away! This happened early in the morning with not many people about, otherwise I would have asked for help. In the end, I drove away very slowly, and the bird went off the side of the car.

On one of the afternoons during the short hot spell, three of us, with a combined age of 260 years, went to Exbury Gardens, with two of my daughters looking after us. We three oldies had the use of electric scooters, which was great fun. Although we had a map, several times we had to reverse because we found steps in the way. There are not many flowers to see at this time of the year, but we got down to the Beaulieu river and watched a few boats. Of course, we stopped for tea and cake! It was a good afternoon that I would recommend. It was probably more enjoyable because there were five of us, which meant lots of chatter and laughter. You do need to book the scooters, but for a £5 hire charge we had 3 hours of fun!




CAMPAIGN LAUNCH on Sat 13th July

Oakhaven Hospice has been a vital part of our local community for over 30 years. The Oakhaven team is currently in the process of shaping the hospice's strategy for the next 5-10 years and welcomes you to spend a few minutes of your time completing a survey.

Demand for Oakhaven's specialist services grows each year. Last year the hospice cared for 1,400 patients and supported over 3,200 local people who visited the Coates Centre to benefit from wellbeing and bereavement support.

It costs £8 million each year to fund Oakhaven's services. Yet just 11% of Oakhaven's funding is covered by the NHS, for the remaining 89% the charity relies on your kind donations, fundraising, gifts in wills and income from the Oakhaven charity shops and social enterprise Oakhaven Care Ltd.

However, like many other hospices in the UK, the current cost-of-living crisis is having a highly detrimental effect on Oakhaven's ability to generate sufficient income to cover day-to-day running costs. According to Hospice UK's quarterly financial benchmarking survey, the UK hospice sector, which supports 300,000 people annually, is facing a collective estimated deficit of £77 million in the financial year 2023-24.
