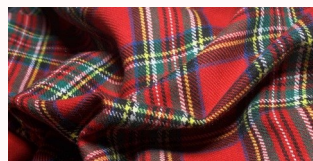

Little known Bible Characters

More of Gill Morris's 'minor' characters in the Bible

Simeon and Anna

Simeon and Anna are only mentioned in a few verses in Luke's gospel but they are wonderful examples of how dependence on God's word, on His Holy Spirit and having a faith that demonstrates trust and patience can enrich a life.

Simeon was a devout Jew living in Jerusalem who knew the scriptures and was obedient to the leading of the Holy Spirit. His life had been one of waiting in prayer and quiet watchfulness for God to fulfil the prophecy of Isaiah 40. He had been told by the Holy Spirit that he would see the Messiah, God's Anointed One, before his death.

When Mary and Joseph presented the baby Jesus in the temple, Simeon recognised Him as the King that had come as a light for the whole world. His prayer, which we know as the Nunc Dimittis, is one of rejoicing and predicts salvation that Jesus would bring to all, as well as mentioning the sorrow Mary would face. Having seen the baby Jesus, Simeon felt his life was now complete and he could die in peace.



Anna, an elderly widow, was a faithful Jewess who had 'retained a glorious enthusiasm for the Lord in her old age'. She had never ceased to worship, spending time in God's house with God's people, to pray and to hope. She persevered in prayer, and in waiting for God to fulfil His promise, didn't lose heart when answers were not immediately answered. She recognised the presence of Jesus when Mary and Joseph took Him to the temple.

Simeon and Anna illustrate that age doesn't matter if a relationship with God is a priority. The wisdom and contribution of the elderly needs to be shared. They teach us to trust, even if God's promises are taking longer than we would like.

The story of Simeon and Anna can be read in St. Luke 2:25-38

Elizabeth Benson

1931- 2025

On 17th November many people met at St. Andrew's to commemorate the life of a valued member, Elizabeth Benson. Her family and her church family thanked God together for her.

Elizabeth and Ron had worshipped at St. Andrew's for over 35 years after moving to the New Forest from Hemel Hempstead. They were both sports-loving people and, energetically, they threw themselves into church life, often volunteering to help.

Elizabeth had worked with children, so was just right to help with the mother and toddler group that started up. She also hosted the Home Group that met weekly at her flat.



After Ron died, she volunteered at the New Milton Community Centre where she helped run the reception desk. She also joined the Bowls club and found she was a relatively good player!

Family and Faith were central to Elizabeth. Her children, grandchildren and great grandchildren meant the world to her. Elizabeth faced cancer and family tragedy in her life, but her faith had brought her courage and fortitude to help her deal with them. She was a good example to us all.

From one of the tributes at her Thanksgiving Service, these words stood out - strength and resilience, honesty and kindness. What better way to be remembered by a loving grandson.

At St. Andrew's she will be remembered with fondness and will be greatly missed.

Scary food facts ...

- The world produces enough food for everyone, but over 800 million people are under nourished
- Roughly $\frac{1}{3}$ of all food produced globally is wasted
- Saving just $\frac{1}{4}$ of this wasted food would feed us all
- In Britain, 40% of edible food never gets eaten, costing the economy £19 billion p.a.
- The average UK family spends £470 per year on food they throw away
- 20 million slices of bread are thrown away **DAILY** in Britain

MY NEW YEAR'S FOOD RESOLUTIONS ...

1. Save money and avoid waste: write a meal plan to buy what I need
2. Use what I have, freeze leftovers, or eat at the next meal
3. Store fruit and vegetables correctly e.g. lettuce and spinach in a plastic bag in the fridge with paper towel to stop it going slimy
4. Eat bread fresh, or slice and freeze it.
5. Support charities like Lymington Foodbank to rescue supermarket food towards the end of its shelf life for families in food poverty
6. Use my **food waste caddy**. NFDC process this waste to make **green energy** and fertiliser cutting down on methane gas going into the atmosphere from food rotting in landfill.

Simply Delicious Christmas Leftovers:

Grummy's Turkey Casserole:

A favourite in the family to this day!

Cook extra mashed potato and make extra gravy on Christmas Day!

On Boxing Day, slice up cold turkey, mix with left over gravy, bits of stuffing, sausage and bacon in a casserole dish.

Cover with mashed potato and pop in the oven to cook for 40-45 mins at 180° until crispy on top and cooked through. Serve with cranberry sauce and a fresh vegetable or frozen peas.



Debbie's Mincemeat Muffins (makes 12):

Use up that ½ jar of mincemeat sitting at the back of the fridge in the New Year

INGREDIENTS:

1 cup mincemeat	½ cup apple juice
1 ½ cup SR flour	2 eggs
¼ cup castor sugar	¼ teaspoon salt
½ cup melted butter	



METHOD:

Preheat oven to 190°C. Fill muffin tin with 12 paper cases.

Combine flour, sugar and salt. Melt butter in a separate bowl, cool a little and stir in the apple juice and eggs. Beat well.

Add the egg mixture to the dry ingredients and combine.

Stir in the mincemeat. Fill each muffin case about ⅔ full with batter. Bake for 20 mins.

Once cooled, sprinkle with a little sugar.

Lower Juniors Trip to Butser Ancient Farm

The Lower Junior visit to Butser Ancient Farm was an unforgettable experience that truly brought prehistoric times to life for the children. Throughout the day, they took part in a range of fascinating hands-on activities that helped them imagine what life was like thousands of years ago. One of the highlights was learning about Stone Age fire lighting. Although the children didn't make a fire themselves, they practised rubbing sticks together to feel the warmth and learnt about the techniques early humans would have used to create a flame.



The children were also thrilled to handle a selection of artefacts — many of which were replicas — as well as one genuine item from the actual Stone Age, giving them a real sense of connection to the past. The children enjoyed chalk carving too, using dock leaves and coal to add natural colour before using flint to etch designs inspired by Stone Age life. Did you know that chalk was formed when tiny marine organisms died and their remains built up over millions of years at a time when the south of England was covered by a warm, shallow sea?

Finally, we had a go at cordage making — twisting and weaving natural fibres to create Stone Age string. The children were amazed to discover that one of the reconstructed Stone Age houses at Butser Farm used around 60 miles of handmade string to tie everything together as no nails were used in its construction. By the end of the trip, they had gained a wonderful, hands-on understanding of how people in the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age lived, worked and created, making it a truly memorable and educational day.
