# **Tiptoe School Report**

Nearly the end of another year for everyone yet in school we are very much at the beginning of our academic year. We were thrilled to welcome a full cohort of reception children this September - with lots of new

families joining the Tiptoe community. All the children settled very quickly back to school routines and are working hard at their learning.

A new concept we have introduced this year is our "muddy learning" which is essentially an outdoor classroom experience for the children and they are absolutely loving it! They have been completing practical maths activities using all sorts of equipment such as hoops, cones, chalks, sticks, stones and so on amongst other things. This type of learning is

especially for those children who struggle with the more formal classroom environment and is part of our ethos to ensure inclusivity and accessibility for ALL children.

Alongside our muddy learning we are looking to also run a Forest School on our grounds. The philosophy of Forest School is based upon 6 principles.

A forest school curriculum prioritizes time outdoors, natural materials, environmental

stewardship, and active outdoor exploration. It takes place on a regular basis and for a sustained period of time. Our children in the Resourced Provision classes have accessed Forest School in a setting outside of school for many years and the benefits they get from it are amazing. They gain confidence in themselves, the ability to team work, learn about taking risk, grow their self esteem and more!

We plan to use our own Forest School to bring this experience to all our children which in turn will help their academic learning and also help each child to become more rounded citizens of the future. We are very excited about this addition to our school and aim to have this fully rolled out by the end of the academic year!



Alongside all this fantastic outdoor-type learning we are obviously working hard on our more academic areas and again have expanded this to include a FOREST curriculum which is all about enhancing the children's cultural capital. Each term we will focus on a different aspect with the six areas being

- F fantastic people & places
- O- originality in art
- R rights, respects and responsibilities
- E environment
- S spirituality & wellbeing
- T to the future

We looked at Martin Luther King's "I have a dream" for fantastic people last term and we are having a whole school art workshop with St Barbe's this term for originality in art. It is very early days but the children seem to be enjoying the sessions and we are hoping to build on this going forward

As you can see there are lots of things going on in school and we are constantly striving to develop and improve the whole experience for the children

Currently we are hosting bespoke tours for potential Year R children for September 2025. If you know of anyone who has a child due to start school next September, please point them in our direction. We would love to show them our fantastic school!

Finally, Christmas is rapidly approaching and we would like to extend our usual invitation to the community to join us for the dress rehearsal of our nativity performance. This is taking place on Monday 9<sup>th</sup> December at 10.30am. If you could let the office know if you plan to attend on 01590 682375 or adminoffice@tiptoe.hants.sch.uk it would help us to know numbers! We are also looking at holding a community carols event for residents to join us on Monday 16<sup>th</sup> in the morning. Further details to follow.

# Buddy Welcome Service All Saints Church, Hordle

On Monday 23rd September, we hosted our annual Buddy Welcome Service in All Saints Church, Hordle. This is one of our most precious services and serves as a really special gathering where we welcome new pupils to both the school and the church family.

This year, the theme of our worship centered around the symbolism of our wooden arch at the entrance to our school. We explored what it meant to be 'together' and the children enjoyed the beautiful picture book 'Together' by Britta Teckentrup, Parents enjoyed the Foundation Stage performance of their Animal Chatter poem before receiving their first gift from the church. Each year, our new pupils receive a candle from the church. a reminder that there will

always be light in their lives and guidance from God. Children take their steps up to the front of the church for the first time with their Year 6 buddy by their side. It is the first step in a truly special bond that the children make over their first year at Hordle Church of England Primary School. Over the course of their first year, they read with their buddies, play with them and make genuine connections. It is the first step in a child's learning adventure here at Hordle and one we are extremely proud of.

### Here are just some of the words of advice which were shared with the Foundation Stage pupils:

"I know it may seem scary but you will learn to love Hordle as much as we do. I know this because I was as small and nervous as you are just a few short years ago. We remember how big our buddies seemed when we were in FS but we also remember the special times we spent together.


The hedgehog is still feeding. Sometimes it leaves some food, but then will

Misbehaving' while in jail for failing to keep up with his alimony payments? Since the tune is nearly 100 years old (1929), who knows, but it makes a good story! One of the best features of this gig was Chris Walker's ability to tell a story, to set the tunes in their context. Along the way we had some salty tales from his time on board ship, and an explanation of how the word 'dixieland' came about (it comes from a ten dollar bill, known as a dix in the French Quarter of New Orleans) - so now you know.

The Swingtet consisted of Chris on clarinet, Tim Eyles on trumpet, Greg on piano, Ken on bass, Simon on drums. The first half featured well known tunes such as 'Basin Street Blues', 'Ain't Misbehavin' and 'Hello Central, give me Dr Jazz'. 'The Old Rugged Cross' also featured.

The second half allowed the band a bit more leeway to experiment with arrangements, call and response, changes in key etc. 'All I do is dream of you' featured really quick bass playing. 'Georgia on my mind' spotlighted Tim Eyles on the trumpet — who was the stand out player for me. Spiritual songs were covered by 'When the saints go marching in' and 'Just a closer walk with thee'.

All in all, a great evening enjoyed by a full house.

# No.4 in Angie's series on the Church's Calendar

# Looking at Lent but no pancakes yet!

Pancake Day, or Shrove Tuesday, is the traditional feast day before the start of Lent on Ash Wednesday.

Lent – the 40 days leading up to Easter – was traditionally a time of fasting and on Shrove Tuesday, <u>Anglo-Saxon</u> Christians went to confession and were "shriven" (absolved from their sins). A bell would be rung to call people to confession.



The first day of Lent is known as Ash Wednesday and many churches hold special services where worshippers are marked on the forehead with ash. Typically, the ash is made from burning special crosses which were used in church services on the previous year's Palm Sunday. It is sometimes mixed with special oil and it is a poignant reminder of what Jesus did for us by dying on the cross for our sins and our need to seek forgiveness.

The word "Lent" comes from the Old English word læncte, which means "lengthening of daylight hours" or "springtime". Many Christians observe Lent in preparation for Easter. It's a time to remember the events leading up to Jesus' death, ask for forgiveness, and prepare to celebrate his resurrection.

Some Christians also give things up during Lent, such as certain foods, as a way to show their devotion to God. In the Gospels, Jesus spends 40 days in the desert fasting and praying, which probably inspired the length of Lent.

### A prayer for Lent

Dear Lord, grant me pardon from past sins, courage to resist all present temptations, and protection against all evils to come, so that I might taste the victory of your resurrection power today and commend your saving grace to others who face their own troubles and temptations. In your powerful name I pray. Amen.

### **RICE**

One day, after years of helping her husband nurture the growing church in the small state of Mizoram in India, Katherine Alen Williams was pondering how they could support a Bible Woman (evangelist) who



had almost no income. Then she recalled what members of the Khasi tribe in another area had done - setting aside a handful of rice – for Jesus.

Williams remembered the teaching that Jesus is the unseen guest at the table and, following the lead of the Khasi, began putting aside a handful of uncooked rice for Christ at every meal. At the end of the week, she had a kilo of rice which she sold in the market and gave the proceeds to the church to help support the Bible Woman.

She taught all the other Christians in the area to do this, and the custom caught on with great enthusiasm. This was something everyone could contribute to pay the salaries of Christian workers. Williams had begun a tradition among Mizoram Christians that dates to 1910.

Lying in the northeast corner of India, Mizoram is an isolated area that is home to just under one million people. To this day, the Mizo people still contribute a handful of rice for Jesus at every meal. On Saturday it is brought to the market and sold at a fifty-percent discount to the poor.

Christians also tithe the firewood they cut and find many other creative ways to give to the church. In fact, 46 percent of the Mizo Presbyterian Church budget goes to missions. This is their highest priority.

The custom has spread to tribal Christians in neighbouring Myanmar, who are even poorer. But in Myanmar, Christians of the Matu people have already been doing what they can, in dire circumstances, to help one another.

"They (the Matu people) said that God had given them healthy bodies, so the women and young men hire themselves out as labourers one day per year to work in the fields, and all the proceeds go to missions," says Joel Hogan.
