

# WELCOME to the February issue of LINK

## A belated Happy New Year to you all!

As LINK returns to monthly issues, I thought this would be a good year to consider particular dates traditionally commemorated by the church.

So as February 14<sup>th</sup> looms, we start with the patron saint of, er, epilepsy. *Epilepsy?* Yes, St Valentine is the patron saint of epilepsy ... and beekeepers, apparently. Of course, since the Middle Ages his patronal festival has been *particularly* associated with - logistics.

But not love; *that's* St Anthony of Padua, on June 13<sup>th</sup>. In fact, as one of the earliest Christian leaders to be officially sainted, there is no single individual that can be clearly identified as him in historical records. Sainthood has often been bestowed on Christian martyrs and the earliest tale attributed to St Valentine is of a Roman bishop who was a passionate evangelist of the Christian faith, but who tried and failed to convert the Emperor Claudius II. He was beheaded as a result - on February 14th.

Only in the last 500 years or so has the tale been embellished, imagining him leaving a note to his jailer's daughter, signed "your Valentine", or secretly conducting marriages for Roman soldiers. The idea then arose that Valentine's day was intended to be a Christian version of the Roman fertility festival, Lupercalia, celebrated on February 15<sup>th</sup>.

So whoever Valentine was, he's not the reason people will be giving their loved ones flowers and chocolates this month – though we don't need a reason to do that! I suspect he would instead point us to a different love, a love that we can all receive - God's love, revealed in Christ:

## Month Long Mission Focus

November Services across the Parish focussed on our Mission Partners - **Leprosy Mission, Tearfund and Bible Society.**

The culmination was our combined parish service at All Saints' on 30th November with Dave and Becky Waterman from **Mission Aviation Fellowship.**

We have been supporting the Waterman's for a number of years and it was great to meet them in person and catch up on their news. Trained as an Avionics Engineer, Dave has played an essential role in maintaining the MAF fleet of small aircraft serving communities in Africa.

After a period of 4 years in Uganda, he and Becky moved to Liberia where Dave helped to develop a regional West Africa maintenance base. Becky has led women's Bible study groups, recorded weekly encouragements from the Bible on YouTube and published her first Bible Study book.

In 2024 they moved back to the UK and Dave is now based in the Ashford office in Kent as Project Manager, Fleet Development and Innovation. Becky is continuing to develop her writing and teaching ministry.



On 30th November, Becky preached from 1 Kings 17:7-16 – the story of Elijah, during a severe famine, asking a widow for bread made from her last morsel of flour. The message speaks of God's provision, even when things seem impossible.

Just like the woman's jar of flour and jug of oil that did not run out, Becky testified to answered prayer and God's faithfulness. When Dave suffered appendicitis and faced an operation in an under-resourced and unsterile local hospital, God provided exactly the right money to pay for the procedure, ensured that the lighting generator was repaired just before the operation which was performed by a highly qualified European doctor just before he returned home. God's timing was perfect.



Family games were important to Marguerite, with her grandson particularly citing the UNO challenges they used to enjoy!

Many were able to join the family in refreshments in the Memorial Hall after the service, a gathering of which Marguerite would surely have approved.

### Abigail


In Hebrew, Abigail means 'source of joy'. Abigail was from the tribe of Judah and was the wife of Nabal, a wealthy Calebite. She was a beautiful and intelligent lady, sensible, capable and she recognised God had a plan for those who acknowledged Him.

Nabal was a difficult and surly man who had insulted David during sheep-shearing. David wanted to retaliate but Abigail, sensing problems, intervened as peacemaker by preparing a feast for David.

She acknowledged Nabal's foolishness and appealed to David's better nature, pleading for mercy. David was moved by her humility and wisdom and blessed her for saving him from committing a terrible sin.

Although this is the only story we read of Abigail, we can learn so much from her. She was an ordinary woman who used her intelligence and common sense to make wise decisions (except perhaps in her choice of a husband!) She saw the needs of others and her actions demonstrated her courage, humility and an understanding of God's will. She made the most of her skills and opportunities and won the respect of those around her. David was impressed by her - after Nabal's death he married her.

Life's challenges can bring the best out of people and, if we act in line with God's will, there can be great blessing.

## THOUGHTS FROM MY GARDEN

In between the storms which pass through, we have had some good days of sunshine with cold frosty nights. The frost is good for the garden. Blackcurrants like it cold and my strawberry plants are now back in the greenhouse after the cold spell. Brussel sprouts taste so much sweeter after they have been frosted!

I have been told raspberries grow best in Scotland; they do like a lot of water, and my garden gets too hot and dry in the summer months, so the few I have left are going to be dug out, which will give me space to plant a new plum tree. There was a mature Victoria plum tree here when we bought this house ... and it has just blown over! It must have been about 70 years old and has been losing branches for about 10 years, especially when there was a lot of fruit on them.

I had been watching five pheasants, two cocks and three hens, walking around my garden when they went near the plum tree and I realised it was at an unusual angle. The trunk is now in logs, with a hole through the middle. No wonder it fell down!

I am beginning to think of the new gardening season; the broad beans and sweet peas seeds can soon be planted in the greenhouse. There will be plenty of purple sprouting later on - I have put the protective bags back on as the pigeons like the tender tops. I just hope they stay on as there is quite a wind blowing at the moment!

Leeks are a regular part of our menu. I think this year has been the best crop I have ever grown.

Take a moment to let that sink in. It's shocking to hear, isn't it?

No child should be told they're cursed. No child should think that leprosy is their fault. Yet myths about the disease mean children like Kamal still endure heartbreaking stigma and shame.

**But Kamal's story isn't one of despair. It's proof that God is at work today,** moving through you to bring hope to His children.

Kamal lives in rural Nepal. When strange patches appeared on his face, his parents took him to a traditional healer. But instead of recognising leprosy, he said that Kamal was cursed by a snake god.

Can you imagine the terror that gripped Kamal's parents? They did everything they could to lift the "curse". But nothing worked.

Each day, they watched in desperation as their son's health deteriorated. And all the while, Kamal wondered what he had done to deserve the pain he was in.

**But thanks to you, God's light was shining for Kamal.**

At Anandaban Hospital, which you faithfully support, he found the care he needed.

Doctors helped him fight the physical battle against leprosy. Ruth, the hospital counsellor, gently explained that he wasn't cursed. She even went to his village to dispel the myths and stigma surrounding the disease. And today, thanks to their dedication and your compassion, Kamal's future looks bright!

**Thank you for being part of God's story for Kamal.** Because you choose to pray and act, the light of Jesus is breaking through the darkness of leprosy and fear.

With God's grace, we can continue to shine out this light together. We can welcome each child like Kamal in Jesus' name, and stop another generation being lost to leprosy.

# New Year reminders of simple Eco Tips - to make a difference to Climate Change

- Check you have maximum thickness of insulation in your roof - no heat wasted
- Replace old lightbulbs with new lowest energy ones e.g. LED or bulbs with an A energy rating.
- Buy locally-grown food - eat food in season so local/UK growers flourish and not the air miles.
- If you have the space, plant a tree - which provides shade in the summer and absorbs greenhouse gases from the air.
- Boil only the water you need - don't overfill the kettle.
- Arrange (through Eco Church team) to have a heat survey in your home to show where you're wasting heat and what to do about that.


