## WELCOME to the June issue of LINK



If you've ever had occasion to look through the calendar of times and seasons in the Book of Common Prayer, you may have been struck by four groups of three days, spread evenly through the year, called **Ember Days**. They are described together as a time for fasting and abstinence and, with their evocative title, you may think they are connected to Ash Wednesday, but you would be wrong. The only thing we can say for sure about the origin of the name is that it has nothing to do with smouldering fire!

It is also uncertain as to what significance they held in the early church, beyond another opportunity to remember our dependence on God and thank Him for His provision through the seasons. Over the centuries, however, they have become closely associated with prospective ordination candidates; ordination services used to be held in these days, and even today you will find the church's official prayers for these days focus on God's provision for ministers and the wider ministry of the church.

I am encouraged that the architects of the church's calendar make space for such prayers. In my ordained role, I am acutely aware that my own abilities are limited and that, even where I have some gifting, nothing I do in my own strength has any value, only that which Christ works through me. Yet He does work through us, as the apostle writes,

*"I planted the seed, Apollos watered it, but God has been making it grow. So neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God, who makes things grow."*

So please pray for me and my colleagues, that we would faithfully proclaim Christ, in Christ's strength. Don't wait for the Ember Days, we need your prayers every day – but if you want to observe a particular date, you might like to consider 'Buy-your-priest-a-beer Day', on September 9<sup>th</sup>!

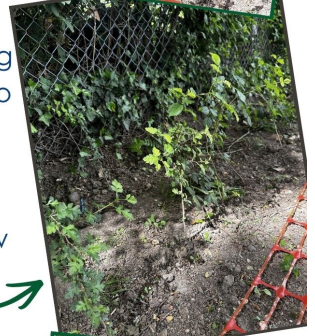
# Sapling Planting

## APCM Report 2026

# A

At the meeting of the parishioners on April 26th, June Bailey and Jane Stocker were elected as Churchwardens for the year. At the Annual Parochial Church Meeting, Clive Gammon and Rachel Carrillo were elected to the PCC and Tony Edmonds to Deanery Synod.

There are 121 on the Electoral Roll, 70 living in the parish and 51 outside.

In his Finance report the Treasurer highlighted the extraordinary generosity that is evident across the entire Church family. The Accounts showed a larger than expected increase in our net Income this year. The combination of regular fund raising for Leprosy Mission, the gift of £3,240 to Hordle School, and the Mission Month donations of £5,488 underline the determination to support God's work. He commented on both Anya and LINK magazine as contributing widely to our ministry. The PCC have been looking closely at the Governance of donated funds. The need to plan going forward was emphasised. There are issues facing the church such as organ repair, heating replacements, audio visual support in the hall, ageing alarm systems and soft furnishing maintenance. Tony emphasised that we are critically reliant on volunteer effort in everything.

In the Wardens' report, Jane said the past year has seen a great deal of activity in maintaining and improving the fabric of our two churches and halls. Two projects have been duly completed, the refurbished kitchen at St Andrew's Hall and the church Foyer at All Saints'. Fabric works are now overseen by the Buildings Committee, chaired by Dr Angus Wood, with responsibility for maintenance of both churches, as well as the halls, and the equipment within them. Thanks were given to Angus and also Mark Strode, who manages bookings for both halls. Thanks too, were expressed to all who give their time and expertise to keep our buildings clean, safe and comfortable to use, and the outside areas in good order. These are too many to name individually, but the practical support is very much valued.

# C

To help us keep abreast of building issues, a reporting form has been introduced which can be completed online or through the Church Office.



In his report the Vicar said it has been a year of contrasts. We have seen the Lord at work in the parish powerfully for good. Yet there have also been a number of challenges and set backs to face. The All Saints' organ has been making a squealing noise. Anya's departure, earlier than expected, has left a large gap. Phil said he is grateful to a range of people who have stepped up to take greater responsibility within our children and youth groups. Anya's departure has also meant Little Angels has had to go on a long-term hiatus. This spring has seen us host the Lunch Club and Tea @ 3 for the final time. Thanks were expressed to Jill and Mike Peace for the many years they have overseen it.

Despite these negatives we have grown. We have gained new members in most of our service streams. Excitingly, three people came to Alpha in January and all three have come to faith.

Simon and Phil have been working to reignite the Mission Committee. In our community of individuals and families, many have been hard hit by bereavements, sickness, or family pressures that have placed a burden of care upon us.

Where does this leave us, looking forward? Phil is convinced that we must trust that God has placed us where we are for a purpose and seek to follow him in this. Let's not pressurise ourselves to reach some new lofty goal, but instead, let us "in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God." Phil will be working in the next few months to foster new ways for us to pray with, and for, one another for the growth and wellbeing of our church. Please pray for him as he looks for good ways to encourage us in this.

## Our pilots are not conventional pilots

They leave behind their extended families, their church, their community, and the comfort of a familiar home to follow God's call. They step into a new land, a new culture, and a new language, embracing a way of life far tougher than the one they left.

Some go alone, surrendering security and stability. Others uproot their spouse and children, asking their whole family to begin again with fewer resources and greater challenges.

These pilots fly with the skill of an aviator, the heart of a pastor, and the courage of a first responder.

People who say 'yes' to this calling are rare. When someone does, we want to honour that 'yes' by equipping them with everything they need to fulfil it. Training a pilot costs around £80,000.

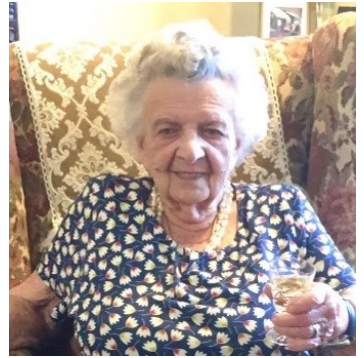

## Margaret Honeyman

The news of Margaret Honeyman's death was announced recently. Margaret would have been 103 in June and had lived the last couple of years in Court Lodge in Lymington, where she was very well looked after.



When Margaret was 100, LINK congratulated her by including an abbreviated article on her wartime service (see June 2023). Margaret enrolled in the First Aid Nursing Yeomanry in 1944 and was ultimately sent to work in the Operations Section of the French Resistance. She described herself as a 'small cog in a gigantic wheel – Churchill's Secret Army.'

She concluded the article with this sentence – 'I think it is wonderful how we are steered through life but not necessarily in the direction we had visualised.'

What a long and fulfilling life she lived!

## This message from The Leprosy Mission was received this week ...



Thank you for your commitment to people affected by leprosy in Odisha. You are bringing such incredible hope to communities who have long felt forgotten!

But there are still huge challenges to overcome.

While crops are growing, begging is still the only way to survive. But for the very elderly and disabled, even this is a struggle. It is harder still in the extreme heat. Unable to beg, people are facing starvation.

You might remember the intensive heatwave that gripped Odisha last year. Without enough food, many people affected by leprosy tragically lost their lives. As temperatures soar above 40°C again, communities are terrified that history will repeat itself.

## THOUGHTS FROM MY GARDEN

This is the time of the year I walk in the Forest hoping to hear the cuckoo. April 18<sup>th</sup> was the first time he obliged and several times since, but the last week there has been no sound. I go to Wootton where, over the years, there have always been cuckoos. I don't blame him; the nights have been cold this last week and I am usually walking by 8.00 am.

I have not put any plants out yet; they go back into the greenhouse at night. The potato rows have survived but I have lost most of the sweet corn grown in pots, as they did not like the cold winds we have had during the day. I had a row of beetroot growing well until the pigeons found them. I have reseeded and covered them.

I have prepared the ground ready for the big 'put out', with all the cane supports necessary. The ground is so dry, when we do get rain, it quickly disappears when the sun shines!

The new plum tree is doing well. I filled the pipes I put in to get the water to the roots, and up popped a bumble bee on his back. I quickly grabbed a leg and left it to recover in the sun.

My daughter and I did venture to the beach one warm day, when the tide was very low. Quite a few people were in the sea. It was very pleasant to sit and relax by the sea again.

I did have an enjoyable trip to Hilliers Gardens at Romsey. We were there by 8.30am for a very good breakfast, and then spent time in the gardens with one of the gardeners. A good way to start the day!

# Let's help Garden Birds to thrive



Our feathered friends are struggling because *Trichomonosis* spreads quickly where birds share food and water. Most affected are Finches. The RSPB has produced new guidelines for feeding birds.

## Feed seasonally, feed safely

- 1. Feed Seasonally: November to April.** If you wish to feed through the summer and early Autumn, feed just a few mealworms and suet, not seed or peanuts which are only suitable as winter feed.
- 2. Feed in Moderation** so that seed is eaten in 1-2 days and suet products in 7 days. Avoid putting fresh feed onto old feed in a container which may now be damp.
- 3. Move feeders regularly** around the garden so food and droppings do not build up on the ground underneath spreading disease.
- 4. Clean feeders WEEKLY** in hot soapy water with mild bleach or avian disinfectant. Rinse and dry well before refilling.
- 5. Avoid flat feeders** such as bird tables.
- 6. Refresh water in bird baths DAILY** with clean tap water. Wash and disinfectant containers weekly.

# The Archbishop of Canterbury met and prayed with His Holiness Pope Leo XIV

**in Vatican City at the end of April.**

After a private meeting, the Pope and Archbishop each gave an address and then joined together in a service of Daytime Prayer. At the close, the Archbishop and the Pope said the Grace together.

Dame Sarah said “Your Holiness, you have spoken powerfully about the many injustices in our world today, but **you have spoken even more powerfully about hope. The world needed this message at this time – thank you.**

“As I begin my ministry, I hope to be a Shepherd who loves and cares for the Church, who encourages hospitality despite our differences, who speaks prophetically into our present reality, and who proclaims Christian hope with the confidence that the gospel of Jesus Christ remains good news for our world today.

“Your Holiness, I am grateful that we are able to join in prayer this morning. In the years to come, I will remain united with you in prayer: prayer for peace in our world, prayer for justice and prayer that every person may come to discover the fulness of life that God offers.

**“In all this we are sustained in hope – a hope grounded in Christ himself, who calls us forward, even when the way is not yet fully clear. May we continue to walk together in that hope.**

“Please be assured of a warm welcome from the Church of England should you honour the United Kingdom with a visit.”

The Archbishop offered the Pope a personal gift of a jar of Lambeth Palace honey, made from nectar from beehives in the Lambeth Palace Garden.

## A pilgrimage milestone has been unveiled and blessed in Southampton

to mark the finishing point of the St James' Way Camino Ingles.

The 68-mile route is travelled by 25,000 pilgrims each year with many continuing to Galicia for the Spanish leg of their journey to the Santiago de Compostela in Spain, one of the world's most famous long-distance walks and pilgrimage routes.

The Lord Mayor of Southampton carried out the unveiling before it was blessed by Bishop Geoff, Honorary Assistant Bishop in the Diocese of Winchester.

**Bishop Geoff said,** “I think pilgrimage is a wonderful thing and it's very much in everybody's thoughts at the moment not least because of Archbishop Sarah and her pilgrimage from St Paul's Cathedral to Canterbury before her installation there. It reminds us that we are all pilgrims. **We've got a journey through life and the great thing for Christians is that we know that we don't make that journey alone, as Jesus walks alongside us.** I hope that this milestone will be a permanent reminder for people going past to think about their own spiritual journeys and their journeys through life.”

The St James' Way from Reading Abbey to Southampton traces the footsteps of medieval pilgrims to Santiago. This is the third milestone along the route with one at Reading and another at St Bartholomew's in Winchester. The church is 100km from Santiago, the minimum distance a pilgrim must complete to gain a certificate at the Compostela.
