## WELCOME to the March issue of LINK



For 2026 I have decided to reflect on a significant date in the church calendar each month, and for March we turn to ... Mother's Day.

Now you might ask whether Mother's Day, or Mothering Sunday as it is traditionally known, is a particularly Christian celebration. But in England it is celebrated on the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Lent – firmly tied to the church calendar – and the origins of the day are intriguing. Since the very early days of the church, this Sunday was set as a day when Christians would return home to the church where they were baptised or raised in the faith – their so-called “mother church”. In time it became a significant day in England for young serving girls to be released for a day to visit their families, a celebration both of the bonds that children share with their mothers, to be sure, but still a wider celebration of all the community who raise us and share faith with us.

I find this encouraging. Today the date has become a day very much focused on celebrating our mums, but whilst this is a great thing to do, it can be a very hard day for those of us for whom the idea of motherhood is painful, either because we never had the chance to experience it ourselves, or because our experience of it has been painful. The origins of Mothering Sunday are instead a much more inclusive celebration of all who play a role in nurturing us. In the shared community life of the church, we all have a role to play in caring for each other, so we can all share in the celebration.

So in all our services on March 15<sup>th</sup> we will be celebrating all the ladies of the church, and whether or not you have your own celebration with loved ones later in the day, you would be very welcome to join the church family and celebrate together!

**Please remember to bring some cash with you on First Sundays!**



## Even on TikTok

Vicars on TikTok make people laugh and make Church less distant. David Sims has been up to all that for five years – but for him it's all in the service of putting the Bible into people's hands.

'He said. 'I made silly videos in lockdown. But I realised people are wanting faith stuff on TikTok.'

TikTok is a social video platform, increasingly popular in Britain where it has about 25 million active users. The good news is there can be a lot of Jesus on there. Once you've seen a bit of Christian content, the TikTok algorithm will feed you more and more.

Thanks to David especially, they're receiving Bibles. It's very easy to find his 'free Bible request' form and get a Bible sent to you just by entering your name and address.

He said. 'Before May 2025 we were sending out five or ten Bibles a month, but now we've lost count. The number of people asking for Bibles has gone over 2,000.

'So every Monday morning at 11 am for an hour and a half, 15 or 20 of us are at a big table packing up the Bibles.



'I know that a middle aged vicar on TikTok isn't cool,' he said. 'I embrace the cringe and go for it. But I'm also quite blunt with what I say. Jesus is the way, the truth and the life.' But in a few seconds, with a funny face or a crazy quote, David has people wanting to read God's word for the first time.

'I got this message yesterday' he says: "The Bible you sent me is honestly the best thing that ever happened to me. I now spend an hour each day reading it, and since I've spent more time I can now see it working in my life."

'When someone replies and says, "My Bible's arrived," I'll say something like, "Great! Can I recommend a local church?" And then I'll hear: "Someone turned up at our church the other day because they saw you on TikTok". It's just amazing. God is so exciting.

'The verse this makes me think of is 1 Corinthians 3.6 when Paul says, "*I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth.*"' (ESV)

# Little Known Bible Characters

## Deborah

In today's world women play a significant part in leadership roles in Government, Church and commercial affairs. It was not so in Old Testament times, but there was one exception who is among outstanding women in history.

Deborah, she was a prophetess and the only female judge in Israel, a woman who held a national leadership position. She played a crucial role in delivering the Israelites from Canaanite oppression. Barak led the army but Deborah accompanied him and provided guidance and encouragement using her skills as a counsellor, mediator and adviser demonstrating how wise she was at planning and delegating.



She was respected and her personality drew people together. She encouraged the people to obey and follow God and reminded them of His promise in Deuteronomy 31:8 and she knew that God could accomplish great things through people who are willing to be led by Him.

### ***What can we learn from Deborah?***

- God calls ordinary people to do extraordinary things through His Holy Spirit.
- Her example inspires men and women to embrace God's calling and lead with wisdom and integrity
- We need to be available to serve both God and others.
- She encourages us to spend our energy on what we can do rather than worrying about what we can't do
- Her story demonstrates the power of faith, courage and obedience to God in the face of adversity,
- Her story highlights God's use of women in significant roles.

At the time of writing this, many of you will, like me, be enjoying watching the Winter Olympics. I do enjoy the curling and the speed skating and generally wonder why anyone should want to lie on their back or front and speed down the ice track! This has produced two gold medals for Team GB. I applaud them and the other couple who won a gold medal for a snowboarding event.



I have just made a trip to Slimbridge Wetland Centre. I had not realized that there are so many different types of waterfowl. Over 30,000 birds visit Slimbridge each winter. I cannot remember how many acres have been enclosed to keep foxes out so the birds are safe. My eldest daughter is a keen bird watcher. She recorded that we saw 44 different species of birds, 11 new ones to add to her list! We spent the evening going through the photos on her mobile phone! It was a very enjoyable day.

I am beginning to think about seeds that need to be planted. The sweet peas and broad beans have already germinated. I will soon plant, in pots, LEEKS, courgettes, peppers and any seeds that need a long growing season. I also grow herbs and have several in the garden like chives, marjoram and tarragon which survive the winter. At the moment, the soil is too wet - I will have to be patient before I do too much.




