

Simon Says ...

Over a third of British people place themselves in a category labelled "Fuzzy Faithful".

The key factor in the definition is that they do not act on their beliefs. Like the existence of Patagonia, they hold some things to be true, but only in an intellectual way that has absolutely no affect upon their lives. They may believe that Jesus rose from the dead, but make no allowance in their daily conduct for such belief. There has been a massive increase in such deluded thinking this century.

Fuzzy Faith is mainly a product of our extreme individualistic culture and postmodern thinking, where things that don't affect me are not "real" in any meaningful way. It may be **safe** to believe in this way, but is it intellectually honest? Does it matter how I treat things I believe? Most of all: is it **true**? Unless I plan to take a holiday in Patagonia, what does it matter whether I believe it exists? What happens if there is an Aid Appeal for people in Patagonia after some natural disaster?

The only faith that counts is one that I can count on with my actions. So a Fuzzy Faith about Jesus will be useless when we find ourselves facing Judgement Day.

St James tells us that 'faith without actions is dead' - in other words, it is not faith at all. He goes on to emphasise that what we believe must be borne out in our attitudes and our lifestyles. Jesus taught and demonstrated this message. Morals are key aspects of this, because they demonstrate our beliefs of what is right and wrong. Do your morals reflect your belief in God? If not, then one or other is wrong.

Is there enough evidence to secure a conviction in a Court where you are accused of being a Christian?



Southampton has a new Bishop!

'It has been announced by Downing Street that the Venerable Rhiannon King, currently Archdeacon of Ipswich, is the bishop-designate of Southampton.

The suffragan bishop of Southampton is a key leadership role in the Diocese of Winchester covering the six deaneries of Southampton, Bournemouth, Eastleigh, Lyndhurst, Romsey and Christchurch.

She will be consecrated as bishop on 18th October and welcomed formally at a service in Southampton, before moving to the city to begin her new role. She will be the



17th Bishop of Southampton, following the Rt Revd Geoff Annas who has been acting Bishop since November 2023, and the Rt Revd Debbie Sellin following her appointment as Bishop of Peterborough.

Rhiannon's ordained ministry to date has spanned the dioceses of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich, Birmingham and Ely. She was ordained deacon in 2000 and worked first in a team ministry in the market town of Huntingdon, followed by being the Rector of a multi-parish benefice just outside Cambridge. She then became Director of Mission for the Diocese of Birmingham which involved leading their Growing Younger project and helping to implement their 'Transforming Church' vision.

She is married to Philip, a physicist and photographer based in Oxford, and together they love to travel in the UK and further afield whenever possible.


Rhiannon grew up in Oxford and is from a strongly Welsh family. She has loved visiting nearby Hampshire over the years and has felt a strong call to this particular role. Her experience working in Ipswich and Birmingham will be invaluable as she moves to serve Southampton, Bournemouth and the nearby towns and villages in the south of the diocese.'

In a short video filmed for the diocese, Rhiannon says, "I love adventures and I look forward to creating some new adventures with God and with you. I have seen God at work so much and know that God can do far more than we can ask or imagine so I am putting my hand in God's, trusting Jesus for everything and hope to spend most of my time encouraging others to do the same."

A few months earlier I had been "taken" unwillingly to a Luis Palau mission. Sadly I could not relate to anything that was going on. I was living in darkness.

A lady told me afterwards that I appeared sad. Yes, I was. My dad had died and my cat had leukaemia. In three days he was to be put to sleep. The lady said, "I am so sorry about your dad. We can pray for your cat." I was very agitated. "God can do amazing things in three days." I wanted to hit her!! We didn't take the cat to the vets because my children couldn't cope with it.

Returning to my story, I called a relative saying I wanted to become a Christian. She sent a Christian friend to see me. A dear lady called Mary was at my door almost immediately. My attitude, unlike hers, was far from gracious. "You say whatever. I will say "Amen.". I muttered. She prayed for me.

When I opened my eyes, I saw my cat had survived. My life was such a mess. I cried out, "What kind of God are you to bless such an aggressive person as me". His love filled me to overflowing. I became a new person. I read the Bible. He has remained my faithful Saviour, my constant Companion, my King, my Brother, my Friend. He is so compassionate and has blessed me in so many ways.

Life is challenging but depending on Jesus makes the impossible possible. My love for Jesus grows and grows. I just love to worship Him.

Christmas in October?

By the time that you read this, shops and media will have started the annual push to persuade us to spend money on things that we do not need, to buy gifts for family and friends, which, if we are honest with ourselves, cost too



much and may not even be liked. Somehow we are dragged into the buying frenzy.

Christmas originates from both the pagan and Roman cultures. The Romans celebrated two holidays in the month of December. The first was Saturnalia, which was a two-week festival honouring their god of agriculture Saturn. On December 25th, they celebrated the birth of Mithra, their sun god.

However, Christmas is celebrated now to remember the birth of Jesus Christ, who Christians believe is the Son of God. The name 'Christmas' comes from the Mass of Christ. A Mass (sometimes called Communion or Eucharist) is where Christians remember that Jesus died for us and then came back to life.

When autumn has given way to winter, when snow may cover the ground, and lights twinkle from house to house, you know Christmas is coming. Decorated Christmas trees appear everywhere, presents crowd for space under the tree and families come together for a turkey feast. Christmas is one of the most important Christian and cultural holidays of the year, but what is the true meaning of Christmas?

Is it the gifts? Is it the annual economic boost?

Christmas is a time of spiritual reflection on the important foundations of the Christian faith. It's also a celebration. Christmas is much more than simply the celebration of Jesus' birth. It reminds us that amid all the joyful customs and celebrations of Christmas, we can see the truth of the Word (Jesus) made flesh for our salvation as Jesus, God's son come to earth to share his love and forgiveness for everyone.

The Bible foretells His birth hundreds of years before, fulfilling prophecies. The Christmas story is recorded in Luke 2: 4-19.



Reminiscences of lives well lived

Many wonderful people have worshipped at St. Andrew's over the years. Two such people were Olive and Dennis Bournon. Dennis worked as an Anglican priest in the north in Liverpool and at other churches in the south. He and Olive retired to New Milton and came to worship at St. Andrew's.

Dennis was a serious and studious man, always prepared to serve. He was the Administrator for the New Milton Christian Housing Association in Whitefield Road, where retired missionaries /



priests and other Christians can find self-contained accommodation. In the nineties he also helped David Price at St Andrew's, where David was House for Duty minister. Dennis worked as finance officer when funds were raised to build the church hall. He organised things, paid the builders, and generally did the paperwork needed. When David retired to Ledbury, Dennis took over for some months and also ran the weekly Bible study in the hall. He never skimped on his preparations!

Olive and Dennis were a great team and their contributions, including Dennis ringing the bell-call to worship on Sundays, cannot be overstated. Dennis liked poetry. He once told me he had a poem he liked very much and wrote out a copy for me (see next page). He never said who wrote it and I have found no trace of it online. Perhaps, reader, you know who wrote it??

Who is God?

Who are you, Lord?
The theologians seem to know - they analyse the texts,
Define and pigeonhole you,
But I am not convinced they know it all.
There's always more: your Spirit ranges free,
Along Your path, not theirs,
I've found out sometimes - painfully.

Archbishop Justin Welby is coming to the Diocese of Winchester on 25-27 October to join us on our journey of faith and mission. For one weekend, he will be walking alongside us ...

- Sharing his story about the life-transforming love of Christ

The focus of the weekend will be on "sharing your story". During the weekend, the Archbishop will be out and about in the Diocese ..

Friday 25th October

The Archbishop will visit a missional community in Southampton before moving to Bournemouth to visit various church initiatives. After Evening Prayer in Bournemouth, the Archbishop will be at Winchester Cathedral, and then out on the streets with the Winchester Street Pastors.

Saturday 26th October

After leading Morning Prayer and Eucharist at Winchester Cathedral, Archbishop Justin will visit Winchester Prison and the Mission to Seafarers at Southampton Docks. His evening will be spent on board the Life Bus in Andover.

Sunday 27th October
