#### WELCOME to the SEPTEMBER edition of LINK



Last month's rioting across our nation's cities may seem a world away from our leafy parish, but it speaks of a tendency we can all face in different ways. Police have described the motivation for the riots as 'nuanced', whilst one volunteer at a mosque in Southport described a 'general sense of frustration'. Life is hard for a lot of people in our country today, and when we face hardship there can be a tendency to want to find someone to

blame, and in finding someone to blame, there can be a desire to retaliate.

The Jews of Jesus' day faced the same temptation. Their nation was ruled by a foreign empire that forced them to uphold laws that constrained their own expression of Jewish faith and culture and they felt, 'We're the victims and Rome is to blame; we need God to give Rome its comeuppance and vindicate his people.'

Jesus responded to this attitude in the sermon on the mount when he said, "Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth" (Matthew 5:5). The Jewish people were right to feel disenfranchised by Rome, but it led many of them to a hardened self-righteousness that viewed others as the problem that needed to be defeated. Jesus calls for meekness which recognises that, before God, we are all part of the problem, and restitution will only come as we humbly ask God to act in his kindness to save. To those who do, Jesus promises he will give them the earth, when he returns to reign over it in justice and mercy.

We are all exposed to the challenges facing our country today; let's pray that God would give us grace to avoid scapegoating others and instead lean on Him to strengthen our faith in Him and our love towards the world around us.

#### Meet Rev Simon Hones, our new Assistant Priest

I grew up in a Christian home at the edge of Bournemouth. Mum is a housewife and Dad was a lecturer in physics at what is now Bournemouth University. My sister, Sarah, and I both went on to study biochemistry, so ours was quite a science-

based household which never had a conflict with our faith.

I have always been curious about why things are as we experience them, and how they work. So the natural world is a constant source of fascination for me: I love to go birdwatching or rockpooling; I find snakes very interesting (I even had a job catching them); I much prefer the countryside to towns; and I love growing unusual plants. There is so much to learn in life, and it's fun.

The same applies to our relationship with God. As with all relationships, it begins with knowing Him. I use an adaption of Richard of Chichester's famous prayer to describe Christianity: Knowing God better, loving Him more and obeying Him more faithfully.

God called me to ordination when I was first at university. I finished my biochemistry degree, but then worked on the shop floor of an engineering company in Sussex, where my colleagues broadened my life understanding greatly. Then back to Uni in Birmingham and Queen's Theological College. Those were infamous for radical/liberal theology and my Biblical faith was challenged at every stage, but grew stronger as a result.

Ordained at Winchester in 1979, I served my Title at Christ Church, Winchester. It had then a huge conservative evangelical congregation.

In 1982 I moved to Chineham, near Basingstoke, where God grew the church from six communicants to over 200 in eight years. I led an ecumenical church with Methodist and URC colleagues and we built a new church to house the expanding congregation.

The next 23 years of ministry were spent in Tolworth, SW London, where God again grew a big congregation with Bible-based faith and active evangelism.

My family are my greatest joy: Laura, Dave, Mike and Eleanor. In an old six-bedroomed vicarage with a big garden in Tolworth we had lots of fun. My wife left us in 2009, so I have been caring for them since. God has answered my prayer that they are all evangelical Christians. I currently have nine grandchildren aged from one month to eight years old.

### All Saints Hordle Summer Worship Afternoon Sunday 5th August

The church family was extremely blessed to be visited by a worship music group from St Wins Church in Totton, for a Sunday afternoon of praise and worship to God. The service was led by Dan Gardner. Dan is a vicar in training at St Wins who is working with Churches across the Deanery to strengthen worship music through events, guidance and general encouragement!



The songs were a fantastic mix of the new and more familiar including I Stand Amazed in the Presence of the Lord, I Speak Jesus and Awake My Soul. It was a wonderful way to spend time together sharing worship together and left many feeling spiritually uplifted and refreshed.

The event also served as a suitable prelude to the new Sunday evening service which is planned to start in the All Saints' Church Hall in September (look out for further details soon!)

The hymns were sung from the heart and the official paper Deed of Licensing, signed by Bishop Geoff, representing the Bishop of Winchester, was presented to Simon.

A sizeable number of people from Simon's previous church had driven across the Forest from Marchwood to support Simon. They certainly were in good voice as the building resounded to fulsome song led by our own able choir. Following the service, refreshments were served in the Church Hall.

Rev. Simon recently moved into Church Cottage opposite the church in Sway Road. He has many years of experience to bring to his role in the Parish and he looks forward to greeting all comers to worship at 10am on Sundays. Please come and join us!

#### Are you confused about the Church's main festival days?

The year in the Christian calendar can seem rather complex but I hope to unravel that in a series of articles looking at the main special days. Some of these will be obvious but others perhaps less familiar. Perhaps, you may not have realised just how many there are.

Advent Passiontide and Holy Week

Christmas Easter

Epiphany Trinity to All Saints

· Lent All Saints to Advent

So here we are in late summer but we shall begin at **Advent** that is seen as the start of a new year in the Church.

Advent comes from the Latin 'adventus' that literally means the 'coming' or 'arrival'. The season of Advent first emerged in the Church in the fourth and fifth centuries and lasted, like Lent, for 40 days. Later tradition developed the Advent we know today, of the four Sundays before Christmas Day. It is celebrated now in the Western Church as a time of expectant waiting and preparation for both the celebration of the Nativity of Christ at Christmas and the return of Christ at the Second Coming.

As the Church prepares to celebrate the coming of Christ, Christians are invited to spend time in reflection and asking God for forgiveness (sometimes this is called repentance or penitence) as we ponder on the amazing fact that Jesus is coming to the world as fully human, to show us something of God's unconditional love for each one of us. Church decorations are simple and sparse, and purple is the

traditional colour used. Advent falls at the darkest time of the year, and the natural symbols of darkness and light are powerfully at work throughout Advent and into Christmas.

An advent ring reminds us of this as week by week, a different colour candle is lit - each representing an aspect of this special season.



Lord Jesus, Light of light, you have come among us. Help us who live by your light to shine as lights in your world. Glory to God in the highest. Amen.

#### THOUGHTS FROM MY GARDEN ...

About a month ago, I found a baby hedgehog by the back door, about the size of the palm of my hand. I gave it some sultanas which it ate, but since then I leave a saucer of hedgehog food, pellets softened in water, under the upturned wheelbarrow for protection every evening. Occasionally, I see it feeding and it is certainly growing. It needs to weigh about 1lb to survive the winter. I can see the next thing will be a house for it to hibernate in!

We have spent another day at the Hawk Conservancy Trust. Although some hawks will be flown, it is mostly bigger birds with a wingspan up to 2m. I think one of the highlights for us is when about 15 birds fly together, eight black kites, two storks, various vultures and eagles, all at head height! A new bird was an Egyptian vulture called Boe, which flew around finding the thermals, and then disappeared for about 15 minutes. He wore a tracker and was over 1,000 ft up, eventually reappearing. How he was brought down is a question for next time.

We finished the day by buying an extra experience. We spent 30 minutes with burrowing owls, only about 6in. high, which live in the burrows made by other animals in South America. We sat with our hands out flat and very soon we had an owl on our hand, which were then fed by the keeper. As there were only five people there, and with two owls, we had quite a few close encounters. They are quite chatty, especially if the keeper was slow in feeding them!

I am still gardening, and enjoying eating the fresh vegetables. This year, the growth of the plants was slow because of the weather but now it is a struggle to keep up with the weeds! The sweetpeas have flowered very well this year, and we pick a large bunch every day. They do not last very long in water, but they do smell nice!



#### 'What is that?'

Is this the question you asked when seeing this 8ft high construction at the New Forest Show or on Station Road in New Milton?

'It's an anthropogenic nest' ...

#### 'A what?'

Anthropogenic means human activity that impacts nature. This 'nest' is made up of litter collected from the forest floor -



and it's litter waste that is increasingly used by birds and other wildlife to make their nests - thus making these 'homes' a toxic and potentially harmful environment for their inhabitants.

What's the answer? What's the message the anthropogenic nest is giving us?

It's obvious - **DO NOT DROP LITTER!** Encourage others not to drop litter. If no bin is in sight, take it home and dispose of it. Though seemingly a small



thing, it's all part of our obedience and service to God by doing as He has asked us - to care for His creation.

#### **Eco Tip**

Keep a hand-picker in the car with a waste bag to take with us when we walk. Wildlife will thank us for it.

NB. If not recycled, it takes 460 years for a plastic bottle to decompose.

Andrew reminds us that Romans is a letter and it wasn't addressed to Martin Luther, to theologians or to universities. It was for everyone in every church in the cosmopolitan city of Rome including slaves and slave owners.
